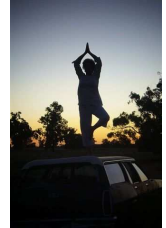

Research Project for OTs

We have the opportunity to run a separate research project for Occupational Therapists!

After an enquiry by a keen therapist who desperately wanted to be involved in our 2008 research project, Dr Christine Chapparo suggested that we run a separate project just for Australian OTs.

She feels that it would be a wonderful opportunity to measure motor function, & that we may find that the children's motor skills will show the greatest improvement of all measures we have been looking at so far. Occupational Therapists could administer a standardised motor test to measure changes with/without the program & Christine is happy to construct a small study - just for them to do.

Initially, we're looking for OTs who service regular schools who could have teachers (K - 3) who would be willing to do the program for a term - the OTs would test each individual child before & after on the Clinical Observations (Ayres) & perhaps another short motor measure.

But we could also involve independent OTs who would be able to put some children 'on hold' without the program for some weeks - then introduce the MTL at a later stage. If they can do this (ethically) it would be OK. We'd need to measure the progress of the children without the program as well as with.
