More tips to make crawling & stomach crawling more comfortable for older children and adults!

Gel Kneepads, used in volleyball, have soft gel inserts inside an elastic support that goes all around the knee. Great protection, (for clothes as well as knees), and they won't scratch your floorboards.



Carpet is best for crawling, but Stomach crawling is easier on a surface with a little slip. A strip of linoleum laid down over the carpet works well, or you might even try some laminate flooring. You can click a few pieces together, without glue, and then put it down as needed. Works outside too!



A woollen baby blanket under the tummy can give a little extra protection as well as make it easier to slip.

If your hips need a little more protection, you can try putting some folded hand towels inside your pants - or even an adhesive sanitary napkin.

Do whatever it takes to keep yourself comfortable, and finally, while you're down on the floor with your kids, keep in mind that stomach crawling is akin to horizontal rock climbing and requires quite a bit of physical exertion. While you're helping your kids and getting all the neurological benefits yourself, you're also getting a great work out !
