Research Project 2008



We have good news. Our research project for 2007 went exceptionally well & the results are encouraging! Dr. Christine Chapparo & her research assistant Joanne Hinitt, are presently processing the statistics, & we are still chasing up some of the results, but they are excited.

Thank you again to all the wonderful teachers & students who participated! I'm sure that the findings will be significant & will help to open the door for all children to have access to this amazing learning booster.

After meeting with Christine, we've decided to implement one further round of research. This will be a little different from previous years, & hopefully a little easier to implement, but equally vital. We will be testing for improvement in the areas of self organization, self regulation, sensory processing & school - social & academic participation - very important areas.

The testing will be by simple yes/no answers which can be completed by a caregiver (teacher or parent) & will need to be answered for each participating child individually. The questions should take approximately 10 mins. per child to answer. Participating teachers would need to organize parents to fill in the forms & collect them, or they could fill them out themselves, or a combination of both. As with our previous research, we are asking that the teacher runs the Move to Learn program with his or her

class for one term. The children will need to be tested before doing the Move to Learn program & then again after. We would also ask that the teacher see that the questions are answered for each child again after a further term where the Move to Learn program is not done, to give a measure of the child's progress without the program.
