All in all very inspirational and lots of fun. Can't wait for the next one!"








Finally, we've been able to put together this fabulous little booklet full of great ideas about how to take the Move to Learn program into the water!

Research

IMPORTANT — PLEASE HELP IF YOU CAN

The researchers who have been analysing the results of our 2008 research have asked once more for our help. Assistance would be greatly appreciated. Published research will go a long way in supporting our efforts to convince decision makers to trial Move to Learn.

This is just a short assessment, with as little as 5 students, and which needs to be done only twice, two weeks apart. You don't need to run the program with the students to do the test.

Hi Teachers,

We are continuing to work on the results of the research studies that have been conducted over that past few years using the Move to Learn program and some exciting results are emerging. Thank you for all of your help so far!

Before we can publish the results and share them with you (and the world!) we need to ask you for your help once again in order to conduct a reliability study for one of the assessments that was used to measure classroom behaviour.

The study would involve teachers completing the assessment (one page tick-a-box) for the children in their class. Then, no more than two weeks later, you would need to complete the assessment again for the SAME children.

We will then look to see how stable the scores are in order to demonstrate that the assessment we used is reliable.

If you are unable to fill in forms for your whole class - that is fine - just choose 5-10 students in your class. The MOST IMPORTANT thing is that you use the SAME STUDENTS when you fill in the second lot of assessments up to two weeks later.

It doesn't matter if you are using the Move to Learn program at the moment in your classrooms, but if you are not, please DO NOT commence using the program within the TWO WEEK reliability study.

If you *are* using the Move to Learn program you keep using it, but conduct the assessment a SECOND time on the SAME children no longer than ONE week apart.

Certification

This is a brand new and exciting direction for us.

We've had several requests to organise some kind of certification process for our more active contacts to give their work a greater level of credibility with new clients. A certificate on the wall can be a helpful asset! It speaks of training and experience and inspires confidence.

We've been aware of that, but until now haven't felt it was a direction we wanted to go in. It has always been our stance that *anyone* can run the Move to Learn program with the assistance of the books & the DVD. Keeping the program simple, with clear guides that are affordable and easy to implement are a key component to making the program available to every child; our mission statement. All that a parent, teacher, helper or student needs can be found in the books and the DVD - or in Ten Gems for the Brain if a DVD player is not available.

But the reality is that not all parents or schools have the time or the confidence to run the program alone. Many deeply appreciate the assistance of someone who is experienced with a broader depth of knowledge to back them up or run the program for them.

We are often asked for referrals to professionals who would be able to help parents or schools in need, and we have a list of those we are confident to recommend, but now we would like to take that a step further.

Certification of practitioners would ensure that a seeking parent or school could be confident that the practitioner was endorsed by Move to Learn.

It will also help to raise the quality of assistance given by practitioners through standardised assessment, and help to ensure consistency of practice and adherence to the principles of Move to Learn as set out in the books and the DVD.

And, most importantly, it will provide greater support and resources to our valuable contacts out there in the field.

Those who wish to run the Move to Learn movement program still won't need to be certified to do so, it will remain open to everyone, but to those who feel certification would be a support to them in their work, we'd like to be able to offer it.

We are still finalising the details and sorting out the higher level of insurance certification will demand, and we'll keep you all updated as we progress, but if any of you have any questions, or would like more information, please feel free to contact us here in the office.
